Memorial Day

Phase Two: Safer at Home

Governor Roy Cooper announced Wednesday that his staff is comfortable with the metrics in the state to lift the Stayat-Home order and move to a modified Phase Two in his reopening plan called "Safer at Home." We all have to continue to be vigilant in what we do outside our home. The virus remains active in our community, and everything we can do to help limit the spread is good for the greater community.
