
Unfortunately, the news out of Raleigh on the rise in positive coronavirus cases is concerning. Positive COVID-19 test results across the country are increasing, and Governor Roy Cooper and his Coronavirus Task Force confirmed this week that same trend is occurring here in North Carolina. Dr. Mandy Cohen, Secretary of the NC Department of Health and Human Services, said in the press conference that the chart to your right is an early warning sign that we are facing another surge in cases.

But, there is still time to correct our course:

CDC Director Dr. Robert Redfield said this week, "In the public square, we're seeing a higher degree of vigilance and mitigation steps in many jurisdictions. Particularly with Thanksgiving coming up, we think it's really important to stress the vigilance of these continued mitigation steps in the household setting."
