Hello Everyone, It is easy to focus on the negatives when it comes to COVID-19, but I want to take a moment to praise the valiant efforts you all have made to limit the spread of the coronavirus, especially on the job.

We have had staff members who have contracted the coronavirus outside of work. However, our ERT continues to do a



great job tracking the cases and contact tracing to ensure no one is missed and work stations are properly cleaned. I am so thankful that all of those who have tested positive have been able to recover and I pray that trend continues. For those who have gotten sick or feel you may have been exposed, you have done the right thing in reporting to your supervisors and staying away from work when you don't feel well.

There is a lot of concern right now as we head into what public health professionals believe will be a surge in cases. I, too, am concerned—for the health and wellbeing of our staff, families, and community members, as well as the toll it will take on all of us physically and emotionally.

- Thursday's 2,400 new cases in NC is the third-highest to date;
- Hospitalizations have been on a steady increase throughout October (currently 1,205 hospitalization as of Thursday);
- 4,082 North Carolinians have died from COVID-19

This is a time to all of to remain diligent in protecting each other. Continue to do what you're doing. And double down your efforts: strictly follow the three Ws. When this is all over, that which is difficult now we will look back on and be thankful 1. That it's over; and 2. That we did what was necessary to protect ourselves and those around us.
