Hello Everyone,

As we head into the weekend, I am heartened by the fact that the numbers of cases and hospitalizations are beginning to stabilize. Earlier this week, it was reported that health care workers across the state have administered more than 1 million vaccine doses since mid-December, and that over 8% of all North Carolina residents have received at least one dose.

I am also encouraged by plans at the state level to put more funding towards vaccinations, schools, and emergency housing assistance. Although vaccine is currently in short supply, doses continue to be administered every day and the state has been clear that it will prioritize "speed and equity" as more shipments arrive.
